



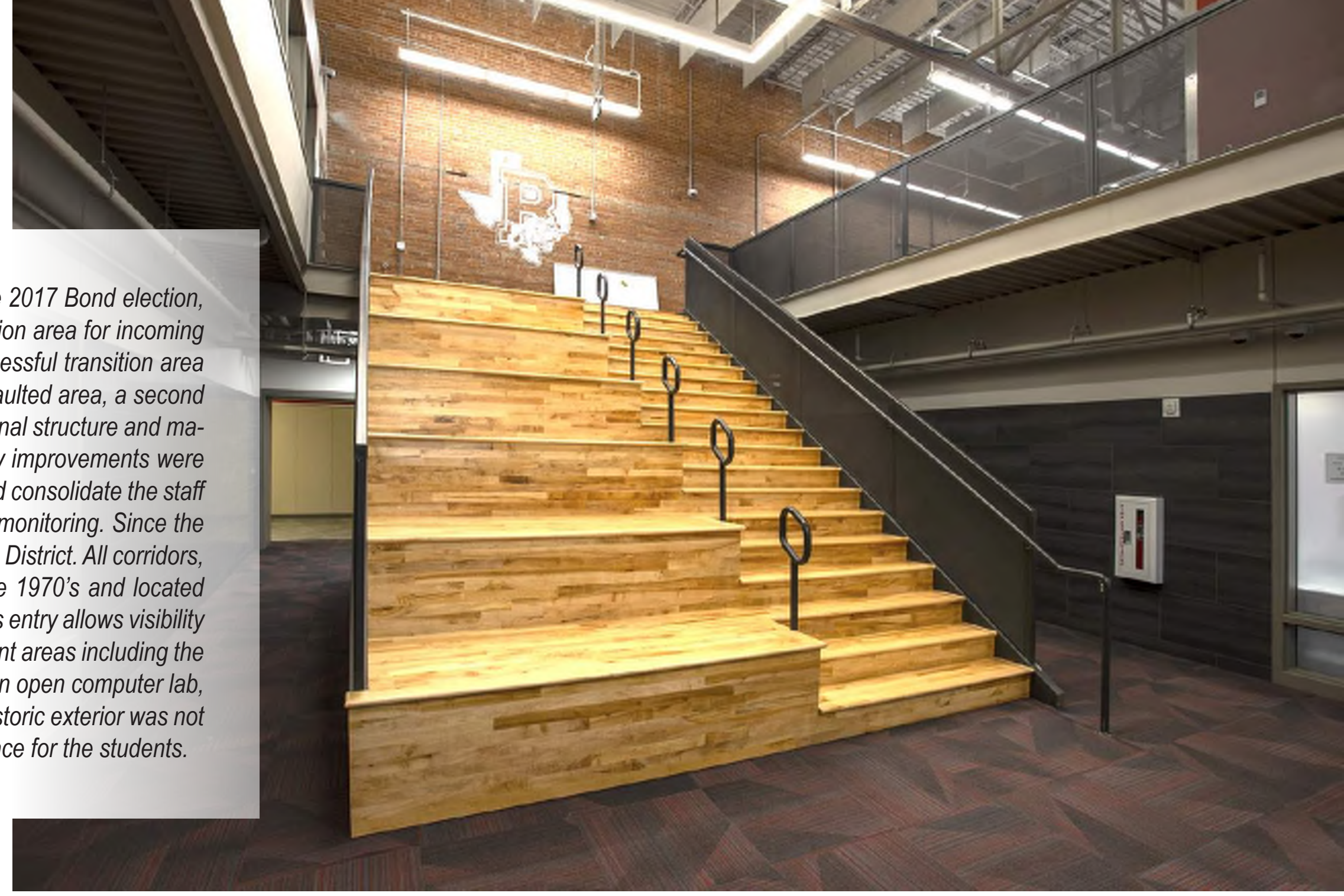
Borger High School

Re-adaptation | Security | Modernization

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The Borger High School was originally built in 1947 as a Senior High and Community College. Prior to the 2017 Bond election, majority of the school was unchanged from the original construction. The District's goals included a transition area for incoming students, security improvements, and modernization of all corridors, learning and accessory areas. A successful transition area was created from re-adapting the original gymnasium into the 9th Grade Academic Wing. Reutilizing the vaulted area, a second floor was added to create 10 classrooms, a social stair and a common area for incoming students. The original structure and masonry were left exposed and the wood gym floor was salvaged and reutilized as accent elements. Security improvements were emphasized throughout the campus. The administration area was reconfigured to create a secured entry and consolidate the staff to be centrally accessible. All other exterior doorways were replaced, and access controls were added for monitoring. Since the original facility has not been renovated since 1947, modernization of the interior areas was imperative to the District. All corridors, learning and accessory areas were renovated for a more modern and collegiate appearance. Built in the 1970's and located directly across from the main entrance, the library renovation was a key focal point to the District. The all glass entry allows visibility all the way through the library from the main entry. The large, open space is spatially divided into nine different areas including the main circulation desk, stacks, a group seating area in a wood alcove, a large flexible multipurpose space, an open computer lab, a group collaboration alcove with writable walls, an office, and two, transparent, collaborative rooms. The historic exterior was not modified but the large original courtyard space was completely renovated to provide accessibility and a space for the students.
